Finally at least 1 sentence of your own choosing, which I would like to describe the volcano erupting.

Think about how you could describe the lava, the sky darkening and the noises you would hear.

Remember this is a description so you need to use a range of adjectives so that the reader can

imagine what you are describing.

Child Directed Time

This week for child directed time I have included some activities that I enjoy doing with my children and thought that you might enjoy doing with your family. Some of them use things that you might have at home and others just need you and your family. You could choose one of my ideas or if you prefer you could choose a different activity that you like to do with someone in your household. Just make sure to enjoy yourselves.

Sock bubbles

You will need:

- A bottle
- A sock
- An elastic band or string or a hair bobble
- Scissors
- A bowl
- Washing up liquid
- Water
- 1. Ask your adult to cut the bottom off an empty bottle
- 2. Put the sock over the bottom of the bottle. (like you would put the sock on your foot)
- 3. Secure the sock with the elastic band.
- 4. Mix some washing up liquid and water in a bowl.
- 5. Dip the sock end of the bottle in the soapy mixture.
- 6. Blow in the top of the bottle. (Where you would usually drink from)





How long can you make your bubble?

Make a rainbow.

You will need:

- A packet of skittles
- A plate
- Water
- 1. Place the skittle around the outside of a plate.
- 2. Add water to the plate so that the water covers the skittles to about half-way up.
- 3. Watch the rainbow.

Floating and Sinking

You will need:

- A bowl of water.
- Waterproof objects from around the house.
- 1. Place the bowl of water in front of you.
- 2. Put objects that you think will float at one side of the bowl and ones you think will sink at the other.
- 3. Take turns to put an object in the bowl.
- 4. Did it float or sink? Were you all correct?

Play, would you rather?

Ask each other would you rather questions. Here are some examples:

- Would you rather be a bird that can't fly or a fish that can't swim?
- Would you rather be a pilot or a pirate?
- Would you rather play in the sunshine or play in the snow?
- Would you rather jump in a pool of marshmallows or a pool of candy floss?

Go for a walk.

Have a nice walk with your family. Look at all of the wildlife around you. Can you spot any animals? You could collect leaves, rocks or shells and make a picture with them when you get home.
