<u>Prenursery</u>

- Exploring Sounds In pre-nursery the children really enjoy playing with
 the musical instruments and making different sounds. I wonder if you and
 your child could find something around your home to make your own
 instruments. For example, you could use a spoon to hit a pan, put some
 rice/pasta in an empty plastic bottle to make a shaker etc etc.
- Mirrors let your child look in the mirror and talk to them about what they can see, can they have a try at naming their body parts and even see how they can move.

<u>Nursery</u>

- Phonics Voice Sounds Explore different mouth movements with your child such as blowing, sucking, tongue stretching, wiggling etc. Let your child look in a mirror to see how they look when they make these movements.
- Exploring Sounds- Help your child to find something around your home to
 make a musical instrument. For example a spoon to hit a pan, put some
 rice/pasta in an empty plastic bottle etc. When you have made your
 instrument, your child can explore different sounds that they make. Can
 they play the instrument loudly, quietly, quickly, slowly etc?
- Maths Language Ask your child to choose an object/toy. Next ask your child if they can find something around the house that is bigger than the toy and smaller than the toy. Can your child put the toy behind them, in front of them, on top of something (i.e. a chair), under something? (words that might come in useful: Big, small, high, low, behind, in front)
