School Dinners

From 5th September Handale Primary School will be reducing the cost of school meals. We have taken this decision as the cost of living increases and we would like to offer support to parent as much as possible. Therefore, we will be charging £1.00 per child per day, this will be reviewed at the end of the academic year. If your child is currently on packed lunches and would like to take advantage of this, please contact Mrs Rowe in the office on 01287 640416 before the end of this term. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to Universal Free School Meals, so there will be no charge still for dinners.

If you think you could be entitled to free school meals it is important to check. This can be done easily by applying through the parent portable <u>https://www.stockton.gov.uk/free-school-meals or via 01642 526605</u>. Even if your child is entitled to Universal free school meals we urge parents to apply to see if you are entitled, as this brings extra income into school to support children's learning.

School Day

The government have announced that all schools from September must offer 32.5 hours of learning per week for all children in school, therefore the school day will be changed from September 2022. The school day will commence at 8.45am instead of 8.50am. The gates will still open at 8.30am form children to arrive before this time.



Uniform

I know some parents have been asking about uniform and wanting to get organised for next year, so I just wanted to confirm school uniform expectations. The uniform for Handale Primary School consists of a yellow/white polo shirt with a royal blue cardigan/jumper. Children can wear black/grey trousers/skirt (No leggings). Shoes/trainers should be black.

School PE kit - white t-shirt with black shorts during the summer and during the colder weather they can wear plain black leggings/joggers with trainers/plimsols. Children can wear their jumper/cardigan on these days too.

Next year we have made the decision that children come into school dressed in their PE kits on the day they do PE. The aim of this is cut down on lost learning time while pupils are getting changed and to avoid forgetting PE footwear.

Punctuality/Attendance

Just a quick reminder that we expect all children to be in school for 8.45am (gates open at 8.30am). Children after this time will need to come through the office entrance and will receive a late mark. Attendance in school is vitally important as it impacts on learning and children can miss such a lot. Children need to be in school as much as possible.

Over the holidays the school website will be updated and all of the photos will be displayed for parents to look through.
